# Fire Walk

On Wednesday 25th September, for the first time, all three of our charities collaborated for an event that saw our fundraisers test if they could take the heat...The Fire Walk 2024.

This event was not only too hot to handle, but a wonderful opportunity for our workers, supporters, fundraisers, and donors to be part of the same event. Hosted at Bridgwater Community Hospital, 15 walkers joined this fantastic event, raising vital funds for our various wards and departments in Musgrove, Yeovil District Hospital and Bridgwater Community Hospital. The event was lead and held by UK Firewalk, who are not only one of the world's leading experts in firewalking, but their founder and our instructor for the evening, Scott, is a two-time Guinness World Record Holder for the longest fire walk...soles of steel!

The event began with an introduction from Scott, outlining the evening, then led everyone to the fire walk area. Our Community and Events Fundraiser, Amy, opened the event akin to the Olympic opening ceremony – armed with a very large fire lighter and aptly accompanied by the sounds of Prodigy's 'Fire Starter.'

Once fires were lit, Scott led the team for a full briefing, outlining the importance of following health & safety



instructions. To put everyone's mind at ease, he even displayed his method of 'showing you something scarier than firewalking': snapping an arrow on his throat, sharp end first! If that wasn't impressive enough, one of our firewalkers, the Matron Nurse of Bridgwater Hospital, also attempted it, and he smashed it! (Or should we say, snapped it?) Kudos to Pete!

Now our firewalkers were ready to face their fears and cross the coals. Still accompanied by suitably fire-themed songs, our fundraisers all completed the 3-metre scorched trail not once, but twice, and some going for thirds! As instructor Scott had promised, everyone completed the walk with a smile.

We want to give a huge thank you to the fundraisers for their efforts – it was inspiring to watch! And to Scott and Chloe of UK Firewalk for helping host the event. So far, the team has raised an incredible £4,000, and we cannot wait to start taking bookings for next year.

# Hippychick

We are incredibly proud to have the support of Hippychick. They have been fantastic supporters of us over the years and this year is very special.

Hippychick, the Somerset-based baby company is celebrating a major milestone this year -25 years in business.

To mark this achievement, the Hippychick team, led by husband-and-wife duo, Julia and Jeremy Minchin, who have been at the helm of the business since its inception, took on a 25km trek across the Quantock Hills on Friday 19th July.

Being a Somerset business, this charity is very close to all of the team's hearts as it has supported so many of them over the years, (including the birth of 18 Hippychick babies) as well as providing vital services and support to the local community.

The team raised an amazing £3,467, which will go towards the renovation of the Paediatric Outpatient Garden and making it a really lovely place for the children to play.

The Hippychick team also visited the paediatric ward laden with armfuls of fantastic items from their portfolio of beautifully crafted toys, including baby walkers and ride ons, developmental wooden toys from Classic World, and a selection of puzzles from US brand Crocodile Creek.

Suzy, Paediatric Matron commented: 'We know how much children and their visiting siblings just love to zoom around outside on a ride on and we can never have enough of



them. Not only do they provide a fun diversion for the patients, but they also offer a great way to encourage children to exercise their muscles, which can be really beneficial if they've been confined to a hospital bed for an extended period. We're so grateful to Hippychick for their generous donation.'

Customers of Hippychick are also donating money directly to the charity when they purchase items via their website.

As part of the 25th celebrations, the team visited the Maternity Unit on 19th October to bring in wonderful Hippychick newborn bundles which they gifted to every baby born that day.





### Ricky JACKSON

We want to say a huge thank you to Ricky who completed the challenge of the Ham to Lyme 100km Ultramarathon on 29th June and raised £600 for the Somerset Neurological Rehabilitation Centre (SNRC).



As if 100km wasn't impressive enough, Ricky only signed up to this event 5 weeks before the event, so to be ready and finish the race is an incredible achievement. Ricky said he received lots of help and encouragement from his 'Strava friends' who supported him step by step to complete this immense challenge.

The money raised will be donated to the SNRC, which is an inpatient neurological rehabilitation setting. They also care for people in Somerset with new onset or recent deterioration of a neurological condition.

Looking ahead, Ricky will be raising money for our sisiter chatiy, Yeovil Hospital Charity, for the Stroke Ward, by running in the London Marathon next year.

## Cycle 42

On Sunday the 8th of September, we were lucky enough to support Iain and Ken in the 6th instalment of the incredible International Cycle 42 for Cancer event.

Having started the event all the way back in 2017, after both of the organiser's families had been affected by the cruel illness and received treatment in the Beacon Centre. lain and Ken made a vow to be in a position to give back to the NHS to make a difference to future patients.

What started as a cycle event that contained 60 registrations, has grown and grown over the last 7 years and has now transformed into the wonderful, well-oiled event we see today. Iain and Ken have had the amazing idea of adding courses and routes every year, boasting 22, 42, and 62-mile cycle routes, along with new marathon and half marathon options for runners. This year saw impressive participation from over 180 people, raising over an outstanding £13,000. It's fantastic to see such a large turnout and

generosity for a worthy cause. With donations still coming in, it's likely the final amount will be even higher. This added to the £25,000 already raised overs years, resulting in an ever rising £38,000! Thank you so much to lain and Ken, who work tirelessly to plan, organise and host this event. A huge thank you to everyone who registered and donated so generously.

This year's event was a truly special one that will live long in the memory for lain, Ken and everyone associated. In the run up to September, Iain and Ken lost a dear friend named 'Cookie' to cancer. Cookie was the photographer for Cycle 42 and will always be remembered for holding such an amazing role on the day. Our thoughts go to lain, Ken and Cookie's family and friends.





In what was a wonderful day for fundraising, Sunday the 8th of September saw one of our incredible supporters round up some of her closest friends, friend's children and others from all around the county to tackle a gruelling walk to raise vital funds for Ward 9.

Sharon, who received treatment in Ward 9 said 'If it wasn't for the amazing staff in Ward 9, I might not be here today, so I want to do something big to be able to give back. You never know when you will need to use Musgrove, so making sure we raise money so they can continue giving the best care was really important to me.'

The walk contained over 30 people from all over the county, who started their challenge in West Bexington and walked across the coast, covering 15 miles and ended in Lyme Regis. More impressively doing so through the wind, rain, and other challenges they faced. Starting at 7:30am and finishing at 5pm is quite an achievement.

We really want to thank Sharon and her amazing team. The amount of people who joined her on this remarkable day is a testament to who she is as a person. We also want to say a huge thank you to all the walkers and those who donated, with the total raised for this day finishing at over an outstanding £6,000.

They have raised a staggering £6,832 to date!




